

New Academic Year Begins

In Cambodia the new Academic Year began in January and we continue to train and mentor teachers to improve learning outcomes for children in early grades. Despite the significant learning loss arising from COVID-19, the data shows that support from SeeBeyondBorders is delivering a significant improvement in learning for children. Provisional results from 2022 indicate double the number of children in our Literacy programme reach Minimum Proficiency Levels (MPLs) compared with children in control schools. We expect to see a further increase this year.







INTO Connections

In November, our Chair Maeve Corish and the Cambodia team welcomed visit а to Cambodia of INTO President John Driscoll and Senior Official John O'Brien to see first hand SeeBeyondBorders programmes in action. Having supported SeeBeyondBorders to bring about educational change for many years, this was a wonderful opportunity for the INTO to experience the impact of their support. We are so grateful for their continued

generosity and engagement. In April this year we hope to represent SeeBeyondBorders at the INTO teachers' Congress in Killarney. Reflections from the INTO's visit to Cambodia recently featured in InTouch Magazine and can be read here.

Thank you also to the TUI for their generous donation from their Global Development Fund which supports the mentoring of teachers in Cambodia and improves the learning outcomes for Cambodian children.

Cambodian Fellow
